Curriculum

Addiction Consult Team (ACT) (Four, 4-Week Blocks) Four blocks giving fellows an opportunity to familiarize themselves with the field of addiction via our consult team at Grant Medical Center. Exposure to patients with substance use disorder and other medical/ surgical conditions in an inpatient/outpatient hospital setting. Each block of this rotation will have a specific focus and added responsibilities as the fellow's progress in their knowledge of substance-use-disorders. The objective of this rotation is to provide our rotating learners with a quality educational experience while providing exceptional patient care to those with substance use disorder.

Acute Withdrawal Management: (One, 4-Week Block) at Maryhaven Addiction Stabilization Center; (One, 4-Week Blocks) at Columbus Springs-Gain the exposure necessary for success in the field, with hands on experience in an acute withdrawal management facility. Fellows dive deeper into the realm of addiction by performing appropriate history, assessment, and management of medication stabilization for multiple substance use disorders. They will also understand the role of an addiction medicine physician within an interdisciplinary team, admitting patients to levels of care on an individualized basis

Emergency Department Substance Use Disorder Treatment: Exposure to care of patients with substance use disorder in the emergency department, with focus on acute stabilization, withdrawal management and linking to services upon discharge.

Opioid Treatment at CompDrug (One, 4-Week Block) Our Opioid Treatment Rotation ensures fellows understand multi-disciplinary care of patients with opioid use disorder with an emphasis on methadone. Fellows prepare and lead educational sessions with other members of the opioid treatment program, demonstrating a commitment to carrying out professional responsibilities involving pharmacotherapy and adherence to ethical principles, including sensitivity and responsiveness to a diverse patient population.

Outpatient Pain Management (2-Weeks) /Palliative Care (2-Weeks) Fellows will assess patients with chronic pain via outpatient pain management at Doctors Hospital. By understanding options for patients with co-occurring substance abuse disorders, they will effectively manage possible side effects, utilizing multimodal approaches including both pharmacologic and non-pharmacologic treatments. By the end of this rotation, fellows will appropriately implement treatment plans that incorporate state and national guidelines for safe prescribing in an effective, patient-centered environment. The second half of the blocks is with Palliative Care for exposure to patients with chronic pain and patients with co-occurring pain and addiction.

Special Population (One, 4-Week Block) Exposure to pediatric patient population impacted by substance use disorder, including newborn and adolescent care. Exposure to gender specific treatment for women with substance use disorder with focus on pregnancy and postpartum period; and adolescents with substance-use disorders and co-occurring disorders and conditions.

Trauma-Screening, Brief Intervention, & Referral to Treatment/SBIRT (One, 4-Week Block) This rotation gives fellows exposure to patients following a traumatic injury via inpatient and outpatient settings, at our adult level one trauma center. Fellows will be able to understand patient chemical dependency, take part in trauma rounds, which include pre-rounding with counselors, and perform addiction consultations that identify intervention strategies to prevent additional injuries.

Inpatient Psychiatry (One, 4-Week Block) Upon completion of this rotation, fellows can properly assess, educate, and inform patients of the risks involved regarding substance use with experience in intensive inpatient psychiatry at Riverside Methodist Hospital. The goal is to provide supervised clinical experience and instruction in the diagnosis and treatment of psychiatric inpatients with a variety of conditions following co-occurring substance use disorders. Fellows will understand the importance of individualized treatment plans by considering psychiatric and medical co-morbidities and managing acute behavioral disturbances in a safe and effective manner.

Longitudinal Learning Experience: Longitudinal experience with local Federally Qualified Health Centers (FQHC's). Focus of experience is on better understanding the needs of our communities and supporting the FQHCs work as it relates to caring for patients with substance use disorders.
